Bear
Any one of a group of large and heavy animals that have thick hair and sharp claws and that can stand on two legs like a person

Bird
An animal that has wings and is covered with feathers

Cat
A small animal that is related to lions and tigers and that is often kept by people as a pet

Dog
A type of animal that is often kept as a pet or trained to work for people by guarding buildings, hunting, etc.

Duck
Any one of many different kinds of birds that swim and have a flat beak, a short neck, a heavy body, short legs, and webbed feet

Frog
A small animal that spends much of the time in water and has smooth skin, webbed feet, and long back legs for jumping

Goldfish
A small usually orange fish that people often keep in ponds or in fishbowls or tanks as a pet

Horse
A large animal that is used for riding and for carrying and pulling things

Teacher
A person or thing that teaches something







Sheep
An animal with a thick woolly coat that is often raised for meat or for its wool and skin
