Instructional Focus Based on the Words in the Book

Word Work
Chrysanthemum

Grade Level: 2 / Guided Reading Level: L

Instructional Focus:
Words Ending in "ly"

Background:
A suffix is a word element placed after the root, which changes the word's meaning as well as its function. In this case, it makes the long /e/ sound word describing a noun into an adverb.

Examples:

lovely	
happily	
extremely	
womanly	
lovely	

Materials and Preparation:

- A Copy of *Chrysanthemum*
- Chart Paper
- Words that End in "ly" P
- Sorting Cards (1 set per student)
- Match Up Score Sheet
- Match Up Directions
- Words Ending in "ly" Word Bank
- Optional - Word Detective Worksheet
- Optional - Index Cards
- Step 2)

Step 1: Introduce the Focus of Word Work

Introduce Words Ending in "ly"

- Draw the students' attention to the chart paper.
- Explain that when the letters "ly" is found at the end of a word, it makes the long /e/ sound.
- Write the word "loudly" on the chart paper. You may want to use a different colored marker to write the "ly".
- Ask the students to think of other words that follow the pattern. Allow students to turn and talk with a partner about the words they came up with or share with the class. Discuss any misconceptions if students share words that do not follow the consonant blend pattern. Record words that do follow the pattern on the chart paper.

Sample Anchor Chart

Words that end in "ly"
lovely
happily
extremely
womanly
lovely

Step 2: Connect Word Work to Reading

The Words Ending in "ly" in the Text

- Tell the students that the book they will be reading today has a lot of words that end in "ly".
- Show them the **first page of *Chrysanthemum***. Tell the students to listen carefully and look at the words while you read. Ask the students to put a thumb up when they see or hear a word that follows the pattern.
- After reading, ask the students to identify the word(s) that ended in "ly" (**absolutely**). Add the word to the chart paper.
- Tell the students that you are going to read the book once from beginning to end. Tell them to be listening for words that follow the pattern. Remind them to be polite and not to interrupt you while you read.
- Read *Chrysanthemum*.

Examples of Words Ending in "ly" Found in the Text:

- absolutely
- misery
- scarcely
- wisely
- exactly
- longingly
- extremely
- completely
- slowly
- eventually

Optional Activity to Extend Engagement

List of words in the book that match the instructional focus

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Step 3: Guided Word Work Practice

Interactive Exploration

- Provide each student with a set of sorting cards (allow students to cut apart the cards or provide them with precut cards).
- Explain that the words on their cards are words from the book that end in "ly" but sound like long /e/.
- Model how to write the root word plus the "ly" on the **Match Up Score Sheet**.
- Divide students into pairs and allow them to play **Match Up** (refer to attached resources for directions).
- Monitor students and assess students' understanding while playing **Match Up**.

Step 4: Independent Word Work Practice

Practice Page

- Give each student a copy of "Y" Rules Word Work.
- Read the directions with the class.
- Tell the students to complete the practice page.
- Monitor students while they work.

Step 5: Reconnect and Reflect on Word Work

Group Discussion

- Bring the students back together.
- Ask students to explain what they learned about words based on the work they completed.
- Invite students to turn and talk with a partner about their word work.
- Invite 2-3 students to share what they learned with the group.

Step 6: Extend Word Work (optional)

Extension Activity

- Ask students to be on the lookout for words ending in "ly" in their own reading. Tell them to write their words on a sticky note and add them to the anchor chart (review the added sticky notes with the class later in the day or before moving on to the next word in the lesson).
- Alternatively, students can keep track of the words using the **Word Detective worksheet**.

Independent Practice Page

Match Up Student Directions

Materials:
Sorting Cards

Players:
2 or more

Directions:

- Write your name or initials on each of your sorting cards.
- Combine all of the players sorting cards to make one deck of cards.
- Place each card face down in front of all players.
- The first player turns over two cards so that the cards are face up. If the cards match, the player keeps the cards, writes the word on the score sheet, and takes another turn. If the cards do not match, the player turns the cards back over so that they are face down.
- The second player turns over two cards so that the cards are face up. If the cards match, the player keeps the cards, writes the word on the score sheet, and takes another turn. If the cards do not match, the player turns the cards back over so that they are face down.
- Continue taking turns. Whoever has the most matches at the end of the game wins.

Tip: Place your sorting cards in even rows. Even rows make it easier to remember where the cards are.
