#### Instructional Focus:

Determining Theme

#### Background:

The theme of a story is the idea or message that the author wants to share. Readers can reflect on theme by asking themselves, "What is this story really about?". Since the theme is rarely explicitly stated, readers must develop the skill of using clues in the text to identify the author's intended theme. Clues are often found in the characters' thoughts, dialogue, and actions and woven throughout the story's plot.

**Crenshaw** is an ideal anchor text for a Book Club focused on determining theme because it deals with a topic that all students are familiar with; friendship. Throughout the Book Club, readers will be able to follow the author's ideas about friendship by looking at both the relationship between the main character and his imaginary friend, and the main character and his real-life friend, Marisol.
