

The Hello, Goodbye Window By: Norton Juster Grade Level: 2 / Guided Reading Level: K Word Work Step 3: Guided Word Work Practice Pass out one "AR" Picture Flash Card Page to each student.
 Direct students to cut out the flash cards on the dotted lines
 Next, instruct students to fold the cards along the solid line s Prompt students to locating up. The policy a cord and write the word that matches the picture on a dry erose board.
 After writing the "a" word, the student will flip the cord over to check his or her crawer.
 Repeat for each card. **A** - Pass out the "AR" Word Choice practice page.
 Instruct students to read the sentence and circle the "ar" word that correctly completes the Practice sentence.

Monitor students while they work. Step 5: Bing the students back together.
 Ask students to explain what they learned about r-controlled yovels based on the work they completed.
