
I Have... Who Has...? Dolch Sight Words (Nouns)


Directions for the teacher:

- Cut the cards apart and mix them up.
- Distribute one card to each student, making sure each student can read the words on their card.
 - Note: There are enough cards for 96 players, making this a great game to play with another classroom! You may need to distribute more than one card to some students or play the cards yourself if you have less than 96 students. Alternatively, you may pair students if you have more than 96 students.
- Notice the numbered squares in the corner of each card. If students get stuck, you can find the next card by asking the students who has the next number on the card. You can also refer to the answer key if needed.

Directions for play:

- The first player reads card #1) ("We are Starting! Who has apple?")
- All players listen to the first person and check their cards to see if their cards answers the first person's question ("I have apple. Who has baby?")
- Play continues until all cards have been read. The final card signals the end of the game ("Lhave wood. That's the end!")










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
